Required materials:

Camera: You will be required to take photos of real-world lighting situations. These photos may be taken with either a 35mm film camera or a digital camera. You turn-in either **5x7** color prints of approximately 24 photos printed on glossy paper. If you choose to use a digital camera, these images may be submitted electronically.

8" Adjustable Wrench: If you do not already own one, buy one now, you will use it extensively throughout the semester in this class.

Course objectives:

The goal of this course is to provide an advanced study of the language, tools and techniques of lighting design for the stage. Students will explore solutions to lighting design problems through extensive analysis of play texts using group discussions and lighting laboratory situations. Further, students will increase their lighting vocabulary by direct observation of lighting phenomenology and real-world lighting situations. A review of lighting technology (including an introduction to intelligent lighting) and stage electrics will be included. An exploration of lighting controls and incluses cueing sessions will also be included.

Requirements:

- **Readings:** You will be required to complete the assigned play or reading as outlined below BEFORE the scheduled class period where the material will be covered. Play analysis will form the foundation for all of the work that we will cover in this course. Failure to complete the readings by the assigned date will result in a zero for that class session's participation points.
- In-Class Light Labs: An integral part of this course will include reading plays and completing lighting laboratory assignments during class-time. Some of these Light Labs will require time outside of class. Light Labs will be completed in the Dreiser Performance and Tech Lab using the lab lighting inventory (specifics to be discussed).

- **Conceptual Hookups:** You will be introduced to a method of developing a lighting design referred to as the conceptual hookup. You will complete three of these for plays discussed in class.
- **Journals**: You will be required to keep a photo journal and a written lighting observation journal as part of this course. Details regarding specific journal entries/requirements will be given as the semester progresses. These journal entries serve as the basis for further class-work, and as such, must be completed by the assigned date as outlined in the course outline.
- Fall Stage Productions: You must see both Fall Stage productions. These productions will be discussed in class following their respective openings. You must see the <u>FINAL DRESS REHEARSAL</u> of *I and You*, and *The Tempest* in order to facilitate a class discussion the following Thursday. You will each write a 2-3 page response paper to both productions responding to the design/production vocabulary. These papers must be submitted via Canvas before the class session in which they are due. Late papers will not be accepted.
- Lighting Work Calls: You must attend at least 2 lighting work calls in order to help prepare for the fall production season and to make practical use of skills regarding lighting production. Each call is worth 50 points. If you would like to attend additional work calls, you may receive up to 50 additional bonus points (for 3 hours of work).
- **Final Project**: Your final project in this class will be to conceptually realize a lighting design for a play. Details regarding this project will provided at a later date. This project will serve as the cumulative capstone of this course. Projects will be presented during the final exam period.
